
# The 36<sup>th</sup> National Hazards Conference 2025

Deregulation, AI and climate change — the critical role of safety reps into the future



5<sup>th</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup> September 2025

In person and online streamed conference at Keele University, Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire. Online workshops, fringe meetings, networking and stalls.

This year's conference will include sessions on:

- Can AI ever be good for our health?
- Dealing with violence and stress at work
- Workers health crisis amid a lack of enforcement
- From climate crisis to choking air what can safety reps do

And again this year, we will be awarding certificates to great health and safety campaigns and calling out the bad employers on health and safety.

The Hazards Conference has always been one of the biggest conferences for trade union safety reps and activists. It consists of a mixture of plenary sessions, meetings, and a comprehensive workshop programme. Delegates have an opportunity to exchange experience and information with and learn from safety reps from other unions, sectors and jobs across the UK. It is a good craic too!

#### How to apply for Hazards 2025

Complete the registration form online or on paper using the form on page 4.

Please apply by Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2025. Applications received after this date will be by agreement only.

**Cancellation:** If you have to cancel but can find someone else to take your place just let us know. If you can't find a substitute delegate: *cancel before 8th August 2025.* we will refund your fee less 10% for administration.

If you *cancel after 8th August 2025*, we will be unable to refund anything, as we will have had to pay for the conference facilities and resources, your accommodation and meals if you are residential or attending in person at Keele University – we will send you any materials and papers.

#### Delegate Fees

Residential Fee: £320

Residential delegates stay in good University accommodation on campus. The fee covers access to all conference events, campus facilities, refreshments and two nights' accommodation with full board Non-residential fee and Online fee: £210

Non-residential delegates have full access as residential delegates, except for overnight accommodation. Online delegates have access to conference sessions through an online platform on the Saturday and access to workshops and fringe events. The cost of the online fee also covers the additional IT costs.
